IMPORTANT REMINDERS FOR CAMPER FAMILIES No Package Policy, Harry Potter, & iPods

Here are some Friendly Reminders about some IMPORTANT Camp Rules (please see the Parent Handbook, available online, for all our camp policies):

No Package Policy: Please remember that Echo Lake does not accept ANY packages during the summer at camp. The ONLY exception to that rule are birthday packages.

If your child has forgotten an important item at home, or needs a replacement water bottle, shampoo, etc., please alert the office that

you need to send this to camp. The package must be addressed to Laurie Rinke, Main Village Director or John Pezzolla, Senior Village Director.

Any packages received will be held in the office until Visiting Day. If received after Visiting Day, it will be held until the end of camp and sent home with your child.

A special word about Harry Potter: We know the next installment of the Harry Potter books is available at the end of July. Our no package policy will also extend to JK Rowling and we cannot accept any shipments of the latest Harry Potter to camp. We are asking our campers – and our LIT's and staff – to wait until August 12th to dig into this masterpiece.

Personal Music Players: Only personal music players (Ipods, MP3's, etc.) that have NO VIDEO CAPABILITY are allowed at camp. Any such items with video capability, WHETHER THEY HAVE VIDEOS LOADED ON THEM OR NOT, are not allowed at camp. The Ipod "Nano" or "Shuffle" are good options as they do not have video capabilities.

As I write this and look at this plaque and this sign, I feel so proud that as camping has changed so much around Echo Lake and around my family, we have been so fortunate to stay right here for 62 years doing what we love more than anything - being Camp Direc-As I anticipate all of our campers' arrivals on June 23rd, I can just envision the mod new haircuts, the green and gold braces, the ginormous smiles, the yells and shouts of laughter, and the first evening line-up of the tors! season! And I will get to reach into my bag of fuzzies and give the first fuzzy of the summer to a camper who did something great - perhaps just by putting their arm around a new camper and saying "it is great to meet you! From the Desks of...



Your first love. Think about it. How did you feel? You were excited, but also a little bit nervous. It made you laugh and sometimes made you cry. You wanted to be the best you could be. You wanted to make the most of every moment you had. If you could have bottled it up you certainly would have tried to. Years later you may have forgotten your teacher's name or your best friend's phone number or the combination to your school locker, but you never forget your first love. Sitting in my bunk at Camp Echo Lake, looking out at the trees and the lake and the cabins, remembering 22 summers worth of memories, I've realized that Camp Echo Lake is my first love. Every morning I wake up and go for a morning workout around camp. Every step I take brings me back to a moment that feels as real as if it is happening right now. Sometimes I think about a camper who grew ten feet tall in front of my eyes because they tried something new at camp. Sometimes I think of a staff person who gave so much of themselves to a child that I can see the impact that adult had on that child unfolding for years to come. Sometimes I remember playing or laughing

or running or singing with so much heart and soul you would have thought my life depended on it. Sometimes I am a camper again and I see myself at moments when camp touched my life that I still feel today as a 32 year old adult. Camp is filled with the spirits of 62 years worth of life impacting fun. I am still in love. I have been on staff for the past 15 years (longer then many of the campers have been alive) and I am more excited for camp to start this summer then any summer since I was a camper myself! I don't know what it is but there is something in the air this summer. All the planets are aligned. I can't wait to pack this place with staff and campers who will fall in love for the first time with Camp Echo Lake.

Roots and Wings. I've heard an expression that the greatest gifts parents can give their children are roots and wings. I like that a lot. From my own experience my parents certainly did that. They grounded me with the roots of strong values, a sense of who I was, and an unconditionally loving and supportive family. They sent me off into the world with the wings to try new things, cultivate friendships, and go out into the world knowing that whether I succeeded or stumbled, the journey was more important then the destination. I think that roots and wings are the greatest gifts parents can give their children and I think they are the greatest gifts that camp can give children as well. Each summer campers reaffirm their place in the camp community, as a valuable member of the Echo Lake family. Campers find their roots in their group, in their village, in being part of Echo Lake.
