I know that Amy will love nothing more than to share a birthday hug with each and every camper and staff who is with us at camp this summer. So if you can remember, wish Amy a very Happy Birthday when you

see her that first night at the Amphitheatre!

As for us, we are counting the days to June 22nd! We can't wait.

The World's Oldest Camper

At the American Camp Association National Conference, I had the privilege of hearing two expert speakers/authors discussing the impact of camp on children's development. Madeline Levine (Teach Your Children Well and The Price of Privilege) and Michael Thompson (Homesick and Happy and Raising Cain) are both psychologists and camp parents who believe strongly that the growth and development that kids experience because of camp, is the most important gift a child can be given in order to develop into their most successful selves. The true benefits of camp are that children are exposed to, supported, and encouraged to build life skills, take

chances, try new things, and figure out who they are. These are all experiences that Levine and Thompson believe must happen independent of and away from parents, and camp provides a safe and healthy place for that to happen.

"Success is not an easy march in a straight line. You have to have the failures along the way, bumps in the road. You don't have a passion until you work at it, fail at it, try other things and then pursue your passion still. Real self-esteem is born out of doing something yourself in order to feel competent and then confident." says Madeline Levine. Levine talks about giving children the "opportunity for manageable failure because, the edge of growth is where healthy failure happens." "Camp," according to Levine, "teaches children values, self reliance, resourcefulness, manageable risk taking, facilitates relationships, builds independence and opens up life's possibilities for children."

Michael Thompson believes that, "Camp is the place where children begin to win their independence. Parents can not give independence or confidence to their child, that must happen outside of the context of the parents." Thompson states, "Parents are so impactful in a child's life that even their presence impacts the experience. Unless children do something on their own, they do not feel complete ownership over it." It is understandable that parents want their child with them, because it's painful and scary for the parent to not be with the child, but it is what the child needs in order to build independence and develop life skills. Levine and Thompson both agree that camp is the single best preparation for college and has a tremendous impact on the children's character.

During your child's experience at camp we will be there for them on their bumpy road to success and create a safe and positive community for them to practice and develop self-esteem and independence. They will play, laugh, make friends, find role models, try new things and push themselves out of their comfort zone in a way that is crucial to becoming their best selves and ultimately happy and successful adults. I encourage you to read Levine and Thompson's books. We applaud you for making the brave and insightful decision that your child will be successful at camp. We are beyond thrilled to create our camp community where the growth and development of children is wrapped up in the amazing experience of camp.

<u>AT HOME DO - IT - YOURSELF ACTIVITY</u>

Being A Conehead And Being Resilient

Some people would say that it is the end of basketball season, but I say basketball never ends, there's just a period of time when there are no games scheduled! This is the time to start focusing on improving your skills –and even three hours a week of dedicated skill individual practice will help you improve your game.



Being a "conehead" is a great way to improve. All you will need is a half dozen or so of those little flat cones that soccer teams use to practice -- maybe you have seen them in your gym class at school. There are many things you can do with them-here are just a couple.

Put a cone a big step beyond the three-point line about three feet off each baseline. Put one more on each wing also a step out from the three-point line and one last one a step beyond the top of the key. Stand right under the hoop with your ball - -there should be five cones out there! Using your dominant hand go as fast as you can around each cone shooting a layup before moving on to the next cone. Shoot two free throws right after and repeat three times. Now do the same with your non-dominant hand. On each trip back for a layup, practice following moves: hesitation dribble, inside out dribble, and cross over. Don't worry about any others -if you can absolutely master these three, you'll have all you need! Now do the same thing, except shoot a 15-foor pull up jump shot after you come around the cone. Don't forget, free throws after! For the third exercise, move the cones in about five feet. Dribble out as fast as you can, stop, and do a self-pass (toss the ball out with back spin so it bounces back to you) and practice shooting off a catch. In all of these drills you will be working on your conditioning too, so go as hard as you can.

Being resilient is also very important. No athlete succeeds without determination and courage. As many of you know, I help coach a very good women's college team. Last year we had a player from California who came to try out. Unfortunately, she was recovering from a knee injury, could not play her best and so got cur. This year she came out again. Even though we had many experienced players and some talented recruits, it was easy to see how much she improved. Not only did she make the team, she worked her way into our playing rotation, eventually became a starter, and is now one of our top players. She did it through practice and hard work -who knows, maybe she was a "conehead!"
