




As of June 5th, there are 23 days until Summer 2014 begins at Camp Echo Lake - Our 69th summer!!!



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I hope that you have been enjoying our new Camp Echo Lake Blog. From the Clipboard of Tony Stein...

There is one recurring theme of the individual Head Staff posts that I have loved to read. And that is the sense that each year they know that - and thrive on the fact that we look hard at ourselves in the mirror to address those areas where we can improve for the upcoming summer. There is no complacency or resting on past successful summers. There is a constant emphasis on examining ourselves both as leaders of the Echo Lake community and as those whose decisions and planning impact the summer experience for campers, staff and parents.

I am proud to know that our Head Staff operate this way and is bought in at such an involved level. Still each year we welcome new staff to Echo Lake and our most vital role is getting our new staff to buy into what Echo Lake is all about. Thankfully, we have had success on this front, and I believe it is attributed to three things ... a) finding and hiring the right people, b) communicating right from the beginning of the application process what it is we do and believe and c) throwing our arms around them well in advance of camp to make them feel welcome to the Echo Lake Community. Laurie and Brenda have written about this in some detail in their article, but I wanted to emphasize these key points here as they are THE essential elements for a successful staff.

Finding and hiring the right people is of course, the key ingredient. Laurie, Brenda, Matt, JP and I all share the task of hiring our staff and our application process is intended to allow us to find out all about our applicants, their backgrounds, and why they think - and we agree - that they will be caring counselors and thoughtful role models

To get them to buy in to who we are what we do, we start with the application and interview themselves. The questions are many and varied and probing, and they are intended to communicate to staff the level of thought and for our campers. commitment necessary to be a successful staff member. We are very clear about the concept of Human Development and what it is we are trying to achieve - and that excites the right candidates who WANT to be with people

Lastly, well before they come to camp for orientation, we introduce our new staff to the Echo Lake staff community via a vibrant social media presence, wherein our staff introduce themselves to one another, and discuss anything and whose passion is growing young people! everything from coordinating travel to camp to discussing their favorite "summer songs." By the time orientation starts, our new staff will already feel like they are a part of the Echo Lake community.

As we are now situated at camp and waiting for all of you, it has been so exciting to start to welcome back our returning staff (well over 50% of our staff return) and see the excitement on the faces of our new staff as they walk into the place that they have been hearing about and anticipating arriving for many months. 

"I define connection as the energy that exists between people when they feel seen, heard, and valued; when they can give and receive without judgment; and when they derive sustenance and strength from the relationship." – Brené Brown

As the summer is rapidly approaching, we wanted to take a few moments to talk about Camp Echo Lake staff. After the summer, when people

talk about the magic of camp, what they are often referring to is the connection between campers and staff. Whether it's starting with the interview process, training during staff orientation or through ongoing summer supervision, we place a great deal of emphasis on finding and training the best staff we can find. At the core of any CEL staff person is their desire and ability to create positive connections with the campers and their co-staff.

During a staff interview, the majority of our questions focus on actual experiences the applicant has already had working with kids or in situations that may arise at camp. The goal of asking about real life experiences, as opposed to hypothetical situations, is to ensure that each staff person has already exemplified the qualities we are seeking in an Echo Lake staff person. In order to be hired, an applicant must demonstrate the ability to connect with children in a positive way, flexibility in challenging situations, understanding the importance of being a team player, and being able to have fun, laugh at themselves, and put the campers needs before their own. In order to begin to model the importance of connections for staff, whether it is Laurie, Brenda, JP, Jacko or Tony who is doing the interview, we always help the staff person understand the Echo Lake community so they can make sure they are on board with our expectations. When a staff person applies, we look at them as more than just an application, and truly connect with them in a way that helps make them feel that they are a valued and important part of the CEL community.

We have many goals within the 7 to 14 days (depending on their role and arrival time at camp) that staff is part of Orientation. Starting and ending with connections is always at the root of what we do. We start with three basic ones: First, as this is more than a summer job, Echo Lake will be the staffs' summer home for two months, we want to help them feel comfortable and acclimated at camp. Second, we find fun and nonthreatening ways (just like we do for the campers when they arrive!) for the staff to connect with each other and make some friends. Third, we emphasize with staff that everything they do with campers over the summer – whether that is laughing, crying, coaching, motivating, or anything else – hinges on positive connections with each individual child and their role in their group.

Once these basic goals are met, we spend a good deal of time training staff on a variety of social, emotional, physical, and psychological topics. As safety is always paramount to what we do at camp, we review and practice safety protocols, train every staff on how to use an Epi Pen, and discuss healthy living and safety in the water, on the fields, and in the bunks.

For our leadership staff, time is spent talking about setting a positive tone for a group, supervising people you work with, and conducting yourself as an exemplary leader in both your words and your actions. For the activity staff, time is dedicated to ensure that they are coaching and teaching the campers excellent skills at beginner, intermediate, and advanced levels and motivating campers to try new things at every activity. The male and female staff each spend multiple hours discussing and learning both proactive and reactive tools for addressing social dynamics in the group and social skills for individual campers.

Additionally, we give the staff a chance to experience Tribal, perform on stage, swim in the lake, and dress up in crazy costumes. Not only does this allow them to "play camp" a bit, but it also allows them to truly experience the importance that their positive and fun attitude can have on these experiences for the campers all summer long. Orientation is a time where staff are enculturated into the Echo Lake community so that they can help experience, learn, and then implement the magic of Camp Echo Lake when the campers arrive.

We view the staff orientation week before the campers arrive as only the first part of training. The true understanding, practice and implementation of the values and skills we expect from staff can, of course, only happen once the campers arrive. We recognize and accept each staff person's growth throughout each summer. With the foundation of connections that are developed and nurtured throughout the interview and orientation process, staff can count on guidance and redirection from head staff when necessary. We are not in pursuit of perfection from campers or staff, but rather a willingness to learn from continued experiences and sometimes from making mistakes. The building blocks of connections with campers, co-counselors and leadership staff create a solid base for each staff person to give their all – knowing that they will never be left alone to either cope with a challenging situation or to celebrate a victory. Echo Lake is a community where ongoing support, feedback and evaluation are all stepping stones toward the final product of solid connections between campers and staff, which lead to the ultimate goal: a successful summer for everyone!

It is true that whether you look to the directors, head staff, cabin and activity staff, or support staff, Camp Echo Lake's staff form a community that envelopes the campers in positive connections. Once a staff person demonstrates through their staff application, interview, time in staff orientation, and on a daily basis all summer long, that they understand and practice the art of connecting with others, they are hired as the true Warm Inner Glow of Camp Echo Lake. That is truly the magic, when children can spend a summer living in a community where physical, emotional, social, and psychological safety is emphasized and lived by every member of the community.




