

Whether it is summers spent at camp, or the 70+ meetings throughout the year with the undergrads (entering 5th through 8th grades) and post-grads (entering 9th through end of 12th grades), or the coaching program for the 11th and 12th graders, or the annual education symposium in New York City, Project Morry is an ever-present positive force in the lives of its kids.

Echo Lake parents and campers have once again stepped up in a HUGE way for Project Morry. The 2007 swimathon/marathon raised \$19,039 to date! In 2008, the goal should be to break \$20,000!

AT HOME DO - IT - YOURSELF ACTIVITY AREA

Be A Super Shooter



Although there are many aspects to being a successful player, one part of the game almost everyone wants to excel in shooting. Remember: Proper Technique is Everything! Proper technique means using the correct form every time you shoot. I know we spent a lot of time at camp on shooting, but let me give you a few of the most important details that make a great shooter:

1.Make sure your feet are pointed right at the basket. 2.Your knees should be relaxed and flexed. 3.The ball should rest on the fingertips of your shooting hand, with the fingers perpendicular to the seams of the ball and the hand right in the center. 4.The elbow of your shooting arm should be bent at 90 degrees. 5.Your support hand should be on the side of the ball, resting as lightly as possible; don't forget, your support hand merely guides the ball—shooting is done with one hand! 6.The ball should be slightly above your head and not blocking your vision—be a two-eyed shooter!!! 7.Your shot starts in your legs—remember the cues we used at camp: LEGS, UP, THROUGH! 8.Shooting is more of a smooth pushing motion than anything else—you should have smooth, fluid release and snap your wrist so there is backspin on the ball. 9.The whole idea is to get the ball to go in a straight line!!! 10.Aim for the back center of the rim and get full extension of your arm. 11.If you are shooting long, raise your elbow slightly; if you are shooting short, drop your elbow slightly. 12.You should extend up on your tiptoes if shooting a spot or stationary shot; you should shoot at the top of your jump if shooting a jump shot. 13.If you are at the limits of your range, you may need to start with your non-dominant foot slightly ahead of your dominant foot and step a bit forward into your shot so you are shooting with your toes parallel.

When you learn to shoot, make sure you use a ball that fits your size. Fifth graders and below should use a ball smaller than a 28.5" ball if possible. 6th and 7th graders should use a 28.5" ball, and 8th graders and up should use a regulation size ball for boys and 28.5" ball for girls. Now, here is an important point: you should never shoot beyond a distance at which you use anything less than great form. For young players, there is a real temptation to get out behind the three line and let them fly - the problem is, unless you are strong enough to use proper technique, you will develop bad habits which will hurt your shooting ability when you get older!

Want to see a math problem that tells you how to be a super shooter?

PT + MP = MITB! (Proper Technique plus Mucho Practice Equals Money In The Bank!)


